Materials List

- 12 Black or blue pens (erasable is OK)
- 10-12 Boxes of pencils (plan on a box of pencils per month-these are the most lost item by 6th graders!)
- Extra erasers
- Colored pencils
- Hand held pencil sharpener
- 2 different colored highlighters
- 3-hole-punched pencil case (some students prefer one for each binder)
- 2 packs of loose leaf paper
- 1 sturdy 2-pocket folder (plastic works well)
- One 3" three ring **STURDY** binder OR Two 1" binders (single binder is preferable for those who are organizationally challenged)
- One 1" binder for World Language (your child may still have his /her 5th grade binder)
- Post-its 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 2 or 3x3 are fine
- 15 Tab dividers
- 1 Composition Notebook (usually have a black marbled cover, but any color is good)
- 2 ultra thin black Sharpies
- 1MG (or smaller) pen drive for saving and transferring information between home and school-some students use an old lanyard from home to make it easier to keep track of the pen drive
- 2 Boxes of tissues to have on hand in the classroom
