## 2005-2006 SCHOOL PROFILE

### SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Falmouth High School is a comprehensive public high school offering a rigorous academic program and a wide range of athletic and extracurricular activities. It has an enrollment of approximately 620 students in grades 9 through 12; the Class of 2006 includes 144 students. Falmouth High School is accredited by the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Maine Department of Education. Sixty-five percent of the teaching staff hold masters degrees or higher. The Town of Falmouth, population 10,000, is a seacoast community on Casco Bay with a long tradition of strong support for its schools. It is a community primarily of well-educated professionals who maintain very high expectations of their students, teachers and schools. Most residents earn their living in nearby Portland, Maine's largest city.

### CURRICULUM

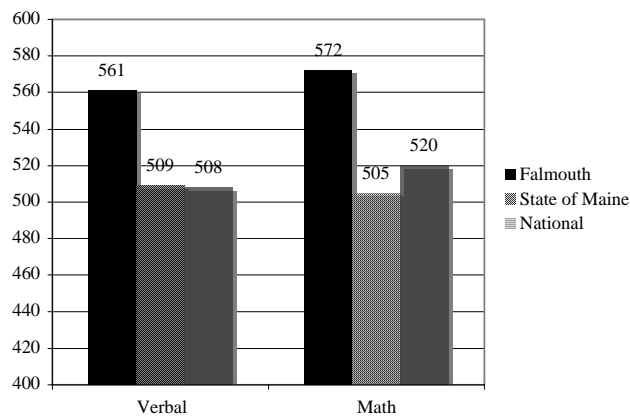
In addition to a full array of challenging college-preparatory (CP) and honors-level (H) courses, Falmouth High School offers a number of Advanced Placement (AP) and college-level courses. The Class of 2006 has had the following AP courses available: English Literature, Psychology, US Government & Politics, Comparative Government & Politics, European History, US History, Calculus, Statistics, and Chemistry. Senior year English Honors is taught at the college freshman level. Additional advanced courses include: Anatomy and Physiology, Syracuse University Project Advanced English (senior year), French V, and Spanish V.

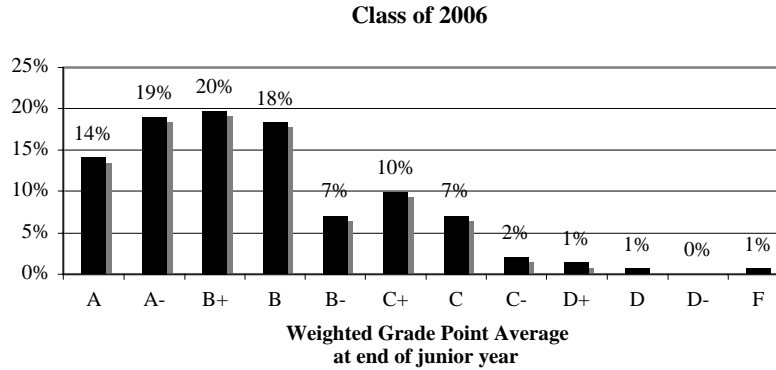
#### CLASS OF 2005 COMPARED WITH STATE AND NATIONAL AVERAGES

## GRADE POINT AVERAGE



Grade Point Average is determined by averaging grades for all subjects for which a full credit (full year courses) or a half credit (semester long courses) is awarded. Honors and AP courses are weighted; they receive an additional .04 point on the final average, which only appears in the calculation of the weighted GPA. The highest weighted average is 104.
