SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Falmouth High School is a comprehensive public high school offering a rigorous academic program and a wide range of athletic and extracurricular activities. It has an enrollment of approximately 650 students in grades 9 through 12; the Class of 2007 includes 152 students. Falmouth High School is accredited by the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Maine Department of Education. Seventy-two percent of the teaching staff hold masters degrees or higher. The Town of Falmouth, population 11,000, is a seacoast community on Casco Bay with a long tradition of strong support for its schools. It is a community primarily of well-educated professionals who maintain very high expectations of their students, teachers and schools. Most residents earn their living in nearby Portland, Maine's largest city.

CURRICULUM

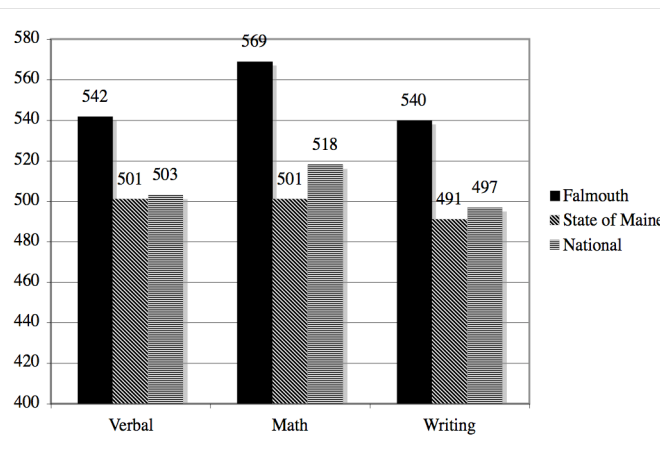
In addition to a full array of challenging college-preparatory (CP) and honors-level (H) courses, Falmouth High School offers a number of Advanced Placement (AP) and college-level courses. The Class of 2007 has had the following AP courses available: English Literature, Psychology, US Government & Politics, Comparative Government & Politics, European History, US History, Calculus, Statistics, Biology and Chemistry. English IV Honors / English IV H SUPA (Syracuse University Project Advanced English) are taught at the college freshman level. Additional advanced courses include Anatomy and Physiology, French V and Spanish V.

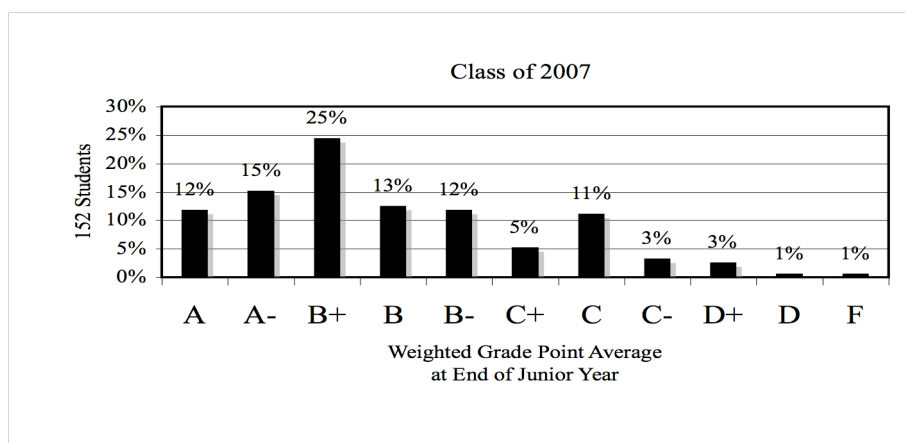
CLASS OF 2006 COMPARED WITH STATE AND NATIONAL AVERAGES

GRADE POINT AVERAGE



Grade Point Average is determined by averaging grades for all subjects for which a full credit (full year courses) or a half credit (semester long courses) is awarded. Honors and AP courses are weighted in the calculation of the GPA only: they receive an additional .04 point on the final average, which only appears in the weighted GPA, not in the course grade. The highest weighted average is 104.
