

## Food Service “Point of Service” Program

All of Falmouth schools will have a new computerized point of service system. We have purchased the NutriKids POS System. The schedule for beginning the program is:

Falmouth High School – Thursday, October 19<sup>th</sup>  
Falmouth Middle School – Friday, October 20<sup>th</sup>  
Plummer Motz School – Wednesday, November 1<sup>st</sup>  
Lunt School – Wednesday, November 1<sup>st</sup>

Every student and staff member has an account in our system. Their account number is the same as their school ID number and will not change from year to year. At mealtime, the students at the high school and middle school may scan their ID card through an electronic card reader and money will be deducted from their account. If they do not have their card or the card does not work, they may punch in their ID number on the PIN pad. It is important that students memorize their numbers in case they do not have their card. The students at the Plummer Motz and Lunt Schools will be scanned by class rosters and will not need ID cards.

If your child receives free or reduced price meals, this information is coded into their account. There is no need for the student to give any other information to the cashier. If you would like for your child to be able to purchase any other foods ( a la carte), you may put money in their account. Students who receive free or reduced price meals must have money in their account to purchase “a la carte” foods.

Parents are responsible for depositing money into their child’s account. This is a debit system, which means money should be deposited first and the cost of the student’s meals will be deducted from their balance. This is the same for staff.

We encourage parents to pay ahead and to pay with check. You may put any amount of money into your child’s account, for the month or for the whole year.

To make a deposit, please send your payment in an envelope with your child’s name, number and grade on the front of the envelope. Please make check’s payable to the Falmouth Food Service Program. Money may be taken to each school's kitchen/cafeteria for deposit.

Cash may still be used in line to purchase food/meals at the high and middle schools.

If you are concerned about a food allergy that your child has, please notify the cafeteria with this information. A warning will appear on the cashiers’ screen for a review of the items on the student’s tray.

If for any reason you would like a copy of the transactions of your child’s account, we will be able to give you a printout.
